## CUALA

Hoping for a change of fortune this year, having been beaten by their opponents to-day in last years quarter final of the senior hurling championship and by Faughs in the previous years final, Cuala face this year's final with expectations that the third attempt will bring them success.

The club finds its origin in an amalgamation which took place in 1975 between themselves, then Cuala Casements and Dalkey Mitchells. Built around the Holden brothers, P.J., Vinnie and Mick they became an established senior club when they won the junior and intermediate championships in 1976/77. This year, tremendous determination saw them through to the final when they defeated a spirited Craobh Chiarain side in the semi-final after 3 hours of superb hurling — one draw and two replays plus two periods of extra time. Who could forget on the final day the rearguard action displayed by their defence particularly John Treacy and Vinnie Holden; not forgetting the three remarkable saves of their goalkeeper Damien Byrne when Craobh Chiarain's last ditch effort to pull the game out of the fire was most evident. Notable players in their selection also include Murty Dempsey, Colm O'Leary and Dave Bernie who have previous inter-county experience with Wexford, Maurice O'Callaghan who has played with Westmeath at senior level, and Damien Byrne, former Dublin senior goalkeeper.

The Cuala club was founded in 1961 and in the early years they had very successful underage teams. Jimmy Doyle took over management of the junior hurling team in 1971 and they won championship in 1972, they went on and won the intermediate championship in 1976 after the amalgamation with Dalkey Mitchells. They have won one junior championship and two junior leagues in recent years. Cuala contested the senior hurling championship final in 1987, senior football championship final in 1988 and they are back again this year for the senior hurling final a fine achievement for the Coiste and the club members in the Dun Laoghaire/Dalkey area.

Played with Irish football team in Australia. Rainbow Rapids Manager.

**KARL SCHUTTE:** Age: 29. Married with two children. Playing with Cuala since U-11. Won Leinster schools U-15, Boland Cup medal 1986. Represented Dublin in minor and U-21 hurling. Investment Executive.

**VINNIE HOLDEN:** Age: 36. Married with 3 children. Holds U-16, minor, junior and intermediate hurling championship medals. U-21, junior and intermediate football championship medals. ## ST. VINCENT'S

St. Vincent's, renowned championship fighters at all grades were founded in 1931 and were accepted, due to their success in Under-age levels, as seniors in 1947 without having to win their way up through the ranks.

The mid-fifties/sixties were the glory years of their senior hurlers. During this period they won eight senior hurling championships and these coupled with their football successes entitled them to be reckoned as one of the stronger dual clubs in the country, if not the strongest. It was only natural after these triumphs that there would follow a lean period and it wasn't until the early eighties that they re-commenced their winning ways at senior hurling level.

To-day they are seeking their 13th senior hurling title and their 4th "second in a row" combination. Their opponents have yet to record their first senior success.

While the St. Vincent's present team may fall short in comparison with the great St. Vincent's of the past nevertheless their line out includes players such as Vincent Conroy, Eamon Clancy, Shay Fleming, Seán McDermott and Shane Dalton, players, who are currently representing Dublin at senior inter-county level.

## ST. VINCENT'S HURLING TEAM

**DAMIEN ALLEN:** Age 25. Now an established member of the team, Damien is playing in his second county hurling final. Honours include one senior hurling championship and one intermediate hurling championship. Accountant. Single.

**PADDY BRADY:** Age: 20. Has showed his versatility by playing in a number of positions during this year's campaign. Second county final. Stockbroker. Single.

**EAMON CLANCY:** Age: 24. His sterling performances in last year's championship earned him a recall to the county team. Eamon has gone from strength to strenght in this year's campaign. One senior huring championship and one intermediate hurling championship. Clerical Officer. Single.

**TOMMY CONROY:** Age: 25. Injuries throughout the year have hampered Tommy's involvement with both club and county. His return to form should be decisive in today's final. One All-Ireland senior football, one Leinster club F, one senior football championship, 2 senior hurling championship. An all-star footballer in 1983. Sales Executive. Single.

**VINCENT CONROY:** Age: 28. Captain of this year's squad, Vincent has lacked consistency in his midfield play, but remains a solid championship player. Three senior hurling championships. Fireman. Single.

**SEÁN CRONIN:** Age: 19. First year in senior ranks and has yet to learn the vital experience needed for senior hurling. Two minor football championships, one minor hurling championship. Student. Single.

**SHANE DALTON:** Age: 24. A regular for both club and county sides since minor days. Always a handful for any loose-marking defence. One senior hurling championship. Division II National hurling league. E.B.S. Official. Single.

**AIDAN DEVLIN:** Age: 28. A former county hurler, Aidan can fill any forward role with great zest. Playing in his fourth county hurling final. Three senior hurling championships. Advertising Manager. Married.

**ALAN FAGAN:** Age: 22. A member of the senior hurling squad for a few seasons and has yet to make the breakthrough into this side. One senior hurling championship and one intermediate championship. Sales Representative. Single.



- SEAMUS FLEMING:** Age: 28. Captain of last year's side and presently captain of the county hurling squad. Three senior hurling championships and division two national hurling league. Company Director. Married.
- JIM HAYES:** Age: 19. One of four minors drafted into this year's squad and is proving his worth with some fine performances this year. One minor hurling and football championship. Salesman. Single.
- EAMONN HEERY:** Age: 25. His hurling activities have been restricted due to involvement with the county football side, where his performances should earn him an All-Star award for this year. His commitment to the club hurlers is, nevertheless, one hundred per cent. One senior hurling championship. Heating Engineer. Single.

- BRIAN KELLY:** Age: 28. "Barney" has played in goal for both the senior and intermediate hurling sides and, is today, involved in his fourth county final. Three senior hurling championships, two intermediate hurling championships and one junior football championships. Service Mechanic. Married.
- DARRAGH LITTLE:** Age: 19. Darragh's first year in the senior ranks has shown him to have what it takes to become a good senior hurler. One minor hurling championship. Insurance Broker. Single.
- SEÁN McDERMOTT:** Age: 25. Over the last two seasons Seán has proved himself to be one of the most lethal of finishers in the game. His consistent ability from frees may prove a decisive factor today. One senior hurling championship and one intermediate hurling championship. Clerical Superintendent. Single.

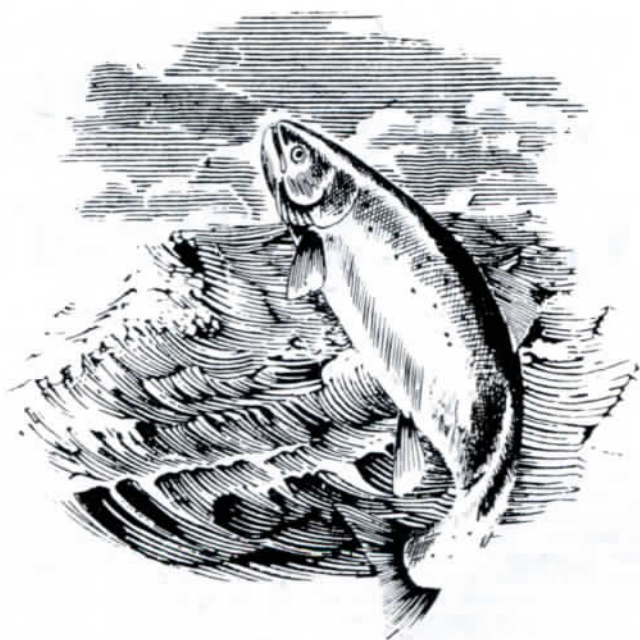

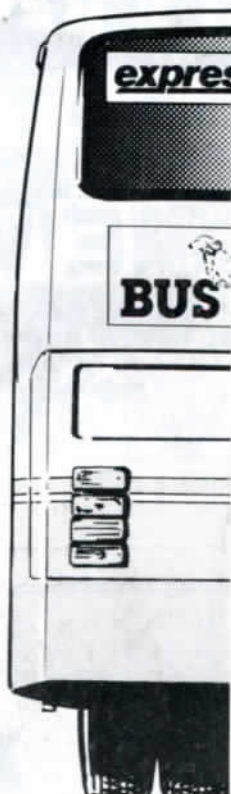
